INTERVIEW GUIDE

Important: when answering the questions, think about an average day. Do not think of a special day that only goes on once a year.

Introduction question

- Can you introduce yourself briefly?
- Can you briefly present the organisation you work for?
 - If the function and job description are not clear; "Can you describe your job within the organisation?

Transition question

- How did you end up in an organisation for adults with intellectual disabilities?
 - If length of employment was not mentioned, "How long do you work with people with intellectual disabilities?"
 - Have you consciously chosen for people with intellectual disabilities? Why did you or why didn't you?

Key questions

- How would you describe your job?
 - Can you give an example of an average day?
- How do you experience working with adults with intellectual disabilities?
 - o What roles do you take on as a professional caregiver?
- What do you think your interventions/activities mean for the person with intellectual disabilities?
 - Can you give an example of a situation in which this is reflected?
- What are ideal activities for persons with intellectual disabilities according to you?
 - What conditions should be met to describe it as meaningful daycare?
- When are activities no longer meaningful?
- · What are contributing factors in enabling meaningful activities?
- What are obstructing factors in enabling meaningful activities?
- What support do you need in enabling meaningful activities for adults with intellectual disabilities?
 - Where do you feel insecure in enabling meaningful activities?
 - What information do you still require concerning meaningful activities?

Final question

- How would you describe 'meaningful activities'?
- Are there things you would like to add to this interview?
